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RE = Roading engineer

ES = Earthquake scientist

TC= Tourism consultant

TC: Hi guys, going my way?

ES: Looks like it, what're you doing here in a suit?

TC: I'm a tourism consultant – we've been contracted to sort out how we can get the Kaikoura tourism show back on the road (so to speak).

RE: So we're all looking for answers for Kaikoura

ES: Yep. Three wise men brought here by a...

TC: ...don't say 'star' – too cheesy even for a tourism ad!

RE: How about a quake?

TC: Something moved the earth anyway

ES: Whose fault do you think that was?

TC & RE: Ha! Ha!

RE: Not all the roads lead to Kaikoura – yet - but we're working on that, bringing tar not myrrh

TC: We're working on the gold – golden tourist dollars.

ES: If we can find how faults work we'll have earthquake commonsense, rather than frankincense.

RE: Always a need for three wise men

TC: Don't let my boss hear you say that – she would be livid!

ES: Or my wife! Same!

RE: Sorry, point taken. Always a need for wise *people* to follow the call!
