

We remember that the night before he died, Jesus had a meal with his friends. He asked them to keep on believing that God was always close to them. He broke the bread...

The broken bread reminds us of Jesus giving everything for what he believed. We eat this bread, quietly, in memory of Jesus.

We eat it knowing that the Spirit of God that moved in Jesus' life is with us in our living and loving.

Jesus and his friends drank wine made from grapes at the meal. We dip our bread in wine or juice to celebrate that we are family and friends joined together in the Spirit of God.

Sharing wine together is our way of saying that we will allow the Spirit of Love to be seen in all we do and say.

Let us dip bread in wine or juice and say Yes to the Spirit of Love in our lives.

Bread and wine are shared with the words: 'The Bread of Life' and 'The Cup of Blessing.' We respond with 'Amen' or 'Yes.'
