

INVITATION TO COMMUNION

St Andrew's is an open community and all are invited to
Christ's table.

Wherever you are on your faith's journey, wherever you have come
from and wherever you are going to, whatever you believe,
whatever you do not believe,
you are welcome to participate in the communion.

This is God's meal for all people.

Communion is served by intinction. Come to the front of the church
and receive the bread, or a gluten-free cracker, taking a piece large
enough to dip into the wine (silver cup) or grape juice (pottery cup).
Eat the bread dipped in wine or juice.

If you don't wish to receive communion, you may remain in your
seat or you are welcome to come forward to receive a blessing.



Georgia, a Wellingtonian studying Classical Voice Performance and French at the University of Otago, is off on a university exchange to Paris in August 2013.


To help fund her studies in Paris and London, she has put together this concert.

The decision has since been made to demolish St Stephen's, Bryndwr. They and the people of both St Stephen's and St Giles', Papanui and the parents and students attending St Andrew's College are now exploring new ways of being church for this new time.

We in congregations in Wellington Presbytery face some similar but also some different challenges - so this is one of a series of opportunities we will be arranging for people from our congregations to come and share, to explore, and possibly discern ways that we can address some of our future challenges.
