

INVITATION TO COMMUNION

St Andrew's is an open community and all are invited to the table. Wherever you are on your faith's journey, wherever you have come from and wherever you are going to, whatever you believe, whatever you do not believe, you are welcome to participate in the communion. This is God's meal, not ours.

Communion is served by intinction. Come to the front of the church and receive the bread, or a gluten-free cracker, and dip into the wine (silver cup) or grape juice (pottery cup). Eat the bread dipped in wine or juice.

If you do not wish to receive communion, you may remain in your seat or you are welcome to come forward to receive a blessing (hold your hands clasped in front).

Thistle Inn • 2 September • 7pm *Emission Trading Scheme - beyond the fart jokes* with Andrew Sweet

The New Zealand Emissions Trading Scheme (ETS) is a way of meeting our international obligations around climate change. The ETS puts a price on greenhouse gases to provide an incentive to reduce emissions and to encourage tree planting.

St Andrews Trust

Andrew Sweet will discuss how the scheme was developed, how it's working today and how it will help New Zealand meet the challenges of climate change.

After working in NZ forestry, Andrew took degrees in economics from the Universities of Canterbury and York. He spent several years at the Treasury, including as Manager of International Economics, and was a key consultant who advised on the Emissions Trading Scheme. Andrew is also Chairperson of the New Zealand AIDS Foundation and a keen tramper and climber.

ARPILLERAS EXHIBITION

This amazing exhibition will be open on Tuesday – Thursday this week from 8.30am - 6pm. On Tuesday 3 Sept at 6.30pm there will be an Exhibition Opening. This will be an evening of learning and exploring the world of arpilleras. For more information about the evening, please see the invitation further on in the Order of Service. Arpilleras - tapestries or quilts sewn by women that 'speak out' visually about political repression and human rights abuses through their stitches - convey processes of resistance, memory and the search for truth and justice in a context of repression. Arpilleras originate from Chile where rags were used to create images and then embroided on large pieces of cloth. After the Military coup in 1973, which introduced the Pinochet regime, the Association of Relatives of the Disappeared in Chile began to make arpilleras. They were made from scraps of material collected by woman or donated by the churches. They tell their stories and also became a means of supporting the makers' families.
