



Loitering with intent

Jesus did not discriminate. He loitered with those discriminated against by others. He called people to change their way of life but he never suggested that only those who followed him could speak of God. In his parable he never said that the Good Samaritan needed to change his religion to be a good neighbour, or that the forgiving father had to attend the Temple to welcome back his prodigal son.

Jesus loitered more with those who were not religious than with those who were. Jesus' example was not to build a holier- than- thou enclave but to loiter in the places the powerful were too scared to go. We are called to loiter with those who would not expect us ever to be beside them, to be in the places the Church is not associated with, amongst the excluded and rejected, the struggling and suffering. If we then, in our structures and policies, exclude those folk from being part of our work, then we fail to loiter.

We simply patronise and reject again.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS.

"The stations of the cross go back to the earliest centuries of the church. Many people wanted to walk the land where Jesus lived, and trace his path from the Garden of Olives to the hill of Calvary, the garbage dump outside the city, and then at last to tomb in the garden. Yet many couldn't get to Jerusalem. This led to the ritual devotion of walking the Way of the Cross.

These invite us to a large Way of the Cross, crisscrossing along the earth's face, crossing borders and nationalities, cultures and languages, economic and social lines.

At their truest, they are done in community, walking around the perimeter of the church, or even the neighbourhood or city itself, stopping along the way at sites representing the station of each event in Jesus' journey, so that these events can be remembered and reflected upon. There are moments for silence, for watching, for shared and ritual prayer; and then the community moves on to the next station" Megan McKenna.

This year we will be putting together a New Zealand/St Andrew's version of the Stations of the Cross for Good Friday, 18th April at 10am. You are invited to contribute your own response to one of the stations in the form of a short meditation and prayer for others. This could be done on your own, or with a partner, friends or family.
