

If you don't wish to receive communion, you may remain in your seat or you are welcome to come forward to receive a blessing (hold your hands clasped in front).

## **BLESSING AND SUNG AMEN**



## WW1 ANNIVERSARY: PEACE VIGILS ON 4 AUGUST 2014

Monday, 4 August, is the 100th anniversary of the start of World War One, "The war to end all wars".

Peace Movement Aotearoa, in association with Quakers, is coordinating nation-wide candle-lit vigils on 4 August, in conjunction with pacifist and peace groups in other parts of the world who will be holding vigils to mark the anniversary and to highlight our mutual belief that conflict must be resolved peacefully rather than by war.
