



Introduction

Wherever you are on your faith's journey, wherever you have come from and wherever you are going to, whatever you believe, whatever you do not believe,

The Invitation

Here, at this table, under the welcoming light of a morning star, the God of epiphanies waits to be encountered.

So – though you may be weary and worn by your journey or stained and sore with travel, look up and see the star, lay aside your packs, bend beneath the lintel, and enter with joy for God waits within, to refresh and renew, to comfort and restore, to challenge and transform, to know ... and be known.

Communion narrative and thanksgiving

So now, gathered round this table, we recall and recount how the Epiphany God was made known in the actions and words of Jesus as he shared a last supper with his friends: We remember how the humble service of washing feet revealed the shape of God's Kin_dom; how the blessing, breaking and sharing of bread revealed the pattern of God's life;

the bread is broken

how the blessing, pouring and sharing of wine revealed the depth of God's love;

the wine is upheld

and recalling and treasuring these things we join our voices with those of all creation in recognition and celebration of the grace and goodness of God present and at work in the world.
