- Do this by the end of June.

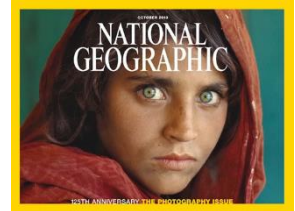

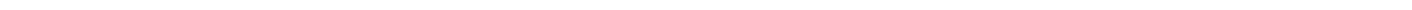
