## INVITATION TO COMMUNION

*St Andrew's is an open community. All are invited to Christ's table. Wherever you are on your faith's journey, wherever you have come from and wherever you are going to, whatever you believe, whatever you do not believe, you are welcome to participate in the communion. Whatever your colour, orientation or status, creed or origin, in this, God's meal for all people, you are included.*

*At St Andrew's communion is served by intinction. You are invited to come to the front of the church and receive the bread, or a gluten-free cracker, taking a piece large enough to dip into the wine (silver cup) or grape juice (pottery cup). You are then invited to eat what you have dipped in the wine or juice.*

*A roving server can bring communion to you in your seat if you prefer. Simply raise your hand so they see where you are.*

*If you don't wish to receive communion, you may remain in your seat or you are welcome to come forward to receive a blessing (hold your hands clasped in front).*
