




### **ST ANDREW'S TRUST FOR THE STUDY OF RELIGION AND SOCIETY**

NZ Red Cross is organising a roundtable discussion with delegates from Asia Pacific Refugee Rights Network (APRRN) at 5.30pm on **Wednesday 9 September**. **Two more people from St Andrew’s could attend if they liked. Let Susan know if interested.**

The Asia Pacific Refugee Rights Network (APRRN) is a network committed to advancing the rights of refugees in the Asia Pacific Region. Delegates will be visiting Australia and New Zealand in September 2015 to meet with groups from the wider refugee community, key stakeholders and relevant government bodies and share updated information about the refugee situation in their respective countries. As an observer of the network, Red Cross is pleased to invite you to an informal discussion with delegation members, local communities and NGOs. APRRN speakers will include:

1. APRRN Executive Director (Thailand): Anoop Sukumaran, with two and half decades of experience working with NGOs, social movements and academia
2. APRRN Chair (Nepal): Dr Gopal Siwakoti, President of International Institute for Human Rights, Environment and Development (INHURED International)
3. Australia: Paul Power, CEO Refugee Council of Australia
4. Indonesia: Yunita, secretariat coordinator of SUAKA (Indonesian Civil Society Network for Refugee Rights Protection)
5. Sri Lanka: Lakshan Dias, Attorney at Law and Human Rights activist working with South Asian Network for Refugees IDPs & Migrants (SANRIM)
6. Pakistan: Imran Khan Laghari, Executive Director at Human Rights Alliance (HRA) working human rights, advocacy and humanitarian protection

The evening will include a panel discussion entitled “Perspectives on rights, responsibilities and opportunities for asylum seeker and refugee protection in South Asia and the Pacific”. This will be an informative evening and a chance to meet people with key perspectives working in the refugee sector. The event will be held at a venue in Thorndon, Wellington and light refreshments will be provided.
