



### **TPPA MEETING**

**27 January 2016 at 7pm** at St Andrew's on The Terrace.

The Trans-Pacific Partnership Agreement (TPPA) negotiations have concluded and governments are planning to sign the TPPA in Auckland on 4th February. But there is widespread public opposition across New Zealand society, with deep concerns over the TPPA's impacts on public health, the environment, climate change, human rights and the sovereign powers of our government to govern in the public interest, rather than the interests of foreign corporations. In the US, strong opposition means that it is looking increasingly unlikely that President Obama can get Congressional approval before he leaves office. International TPPA experts Lori Wallach, from Public Citizen and Professor Jane Kelsey from University of Auckland will talk about the latest research, politics, analysis and actions. This is a free event. Please arrive early to get a seat. Donations to cover costs would be appreciated.

### **EMAIL FROM NICK WALSH CURRENTLY AT MCGILL UNIVERSITY IN VANCOUVER.**

I've had a great first semester - I have had lots of opportunity to perform, and have been playing with the Contemporary Music Ensemble, a Clarinet Quartet and a Wind Quintet, who are starting to get serious about applying for competitions and summer festival programmes. Next semester I'm playing with the McGill Symphony Orchestra, which I'm very excited about. I've been fortunate enough to meet a great bunch of people through school, and have three great flatmates.

My French is still very average, but I'm getting in a decent amount of practice and usually think I'm improving; though some days are better than others.

Everything at uni is in English though, so that definitely helps! My teacher is Todd Cope, who is principal with the Montreal Symphony, and he's been pushing me very hard but I can hear and see myself improving. It's hard to believe that I'm already a quarter of the way through. Time does go very quickly!

The cold hasn't really taken over here just yet. It has snowed a couple of times, but not really stuck. It's been sitting around -2° - 4° most days, which is fine by me.

I have missed St Andrew's a lot - the people, and the services, as well as the opportunities to play in the church so often! I have been going to a church here called St James Uniting - in some ways it is similar to St Andrew's, but still doesn't quite feel like home yet. Thanks for your message - and Christmas greetings to all of you at St Andrew's too! Hope the preparation for this busy time of year goes swimmingly,

#### **MEMORIAL SERVICE AT DCM**


