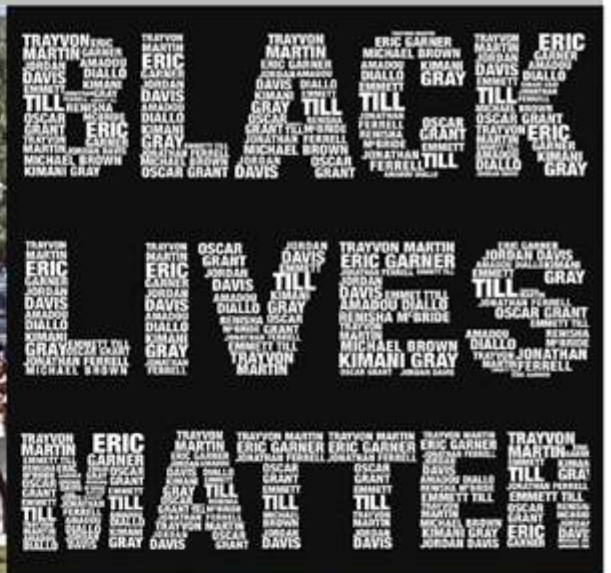

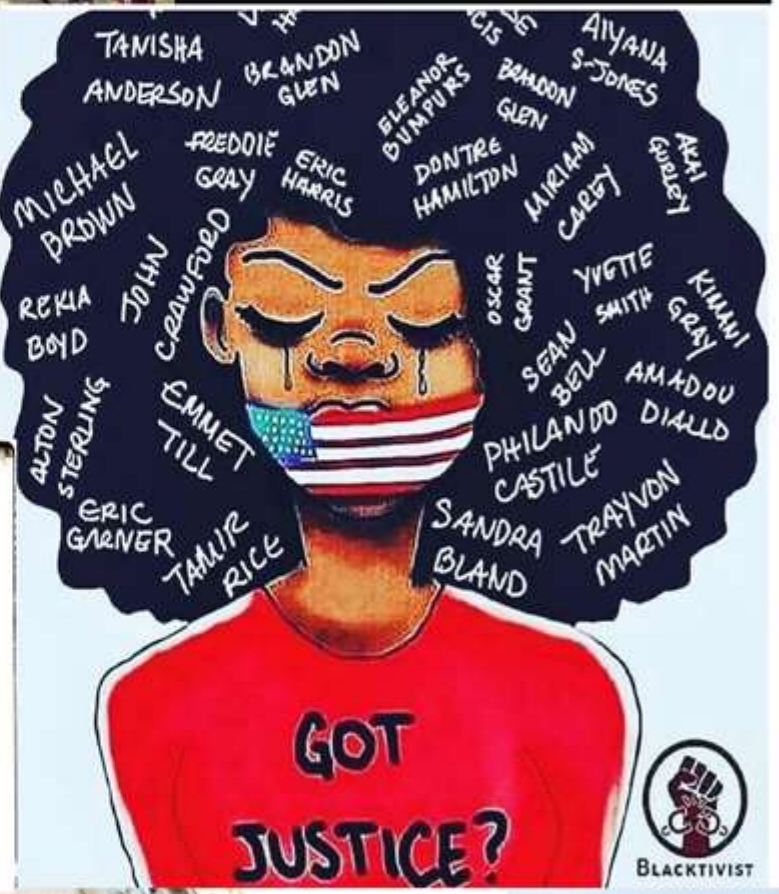

Mike Wespel-Rose writes: "I was brought up in a Christian tradition.

I continue to see myself as a part of that tradition which includes an ongoing relationship with a church - St. Andrews.
