

Mike Wespel-Rose writes: "I was brought up in a Christian tradition.

I continue to see myself as a part of that tradition which includes an ongoing relationship with a church - St. Andrews. But that does not preclude me from seeking support and guidance from other traditions and practices where I find that helpful. At the moment I am participating in a daily 10 minute mindfulness program on the internet. It is presented by one of my favourite modern mindfulness teachers - Jack Kornfield. I am finding it very helpful for my day while it takes only a small amount of time. The first 4 sessions are free. There is payment required to continue with the rest of the 40 daily sessions.
