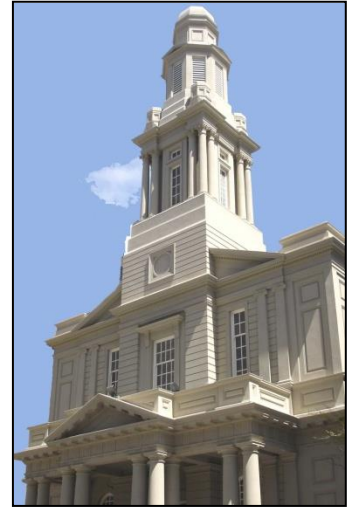


In what strange land will I sing your song,

John Morgan writes; "Wellington City Councillor Brian Dawson praised the living wage campaign at yesterday evening's NZLP Harbour Branch meeting. Brian said that the living wage campaign had done excellent work in creating wide public sympathy for the living wage policy. City Councillors could implement the policy knowing they had public backing. Brian pointed to other campaigns now modelling themselves on the living wage campaign. The outcome of Tuesday's meeting was a 10-3 vote to: support the Living Wage, ask the CEO to draw up a draft remuneration policy for directly-employed staff incorporating the Living Wage and work with Hutt Living Wage Movement on the contractors.
