'Bumping into God'

Anyone who has seen the classic 1999 film American beauty will recall the plastic bag scene. It's where the teenager Ricky asks his friend Jane if she would like to see the most beautiful thing he has ever filmed. Ricky is something of a troubled mystic who sees beauty in the minutiae of everyday life, and videos as much as he can for fear of missing it.

So they sit in front of Ricky's television to watch his cherished film: a haunting sequence of a plastic bag dancing in the wind in front of a graffitied wall. With tears in his eyes, Ricky explains, 'It was one of those days when it's a minute away from snowing and there's this electricity in the air, you can almost hear it. And this bag was like, dancing with me. Like a little kid begging me to play with it. For fifteen minutes. And that's the day I knew there was this entire life behind things, and... this incredibly benevolent force, that wanted me to know there was no reason

to be afraid... ever. Video's a poor excuse, I know. But it helps me remember ... and I need to remember ... Sometimes there's so much beauty in the world I feel like I can't take it, like my heart's going to cave in.

More about the Gathering...

On **August 18-20**, St John's in the City is hosting Nourishment: a Presbytery Central Gathering.

Friday night features an opportunity for fellowship and reflection, or if you're seeking something more stimulating there's a symposium on theology with free admission at the Cathedral of St Paul, only a short walk away.

Saturday is the big day of the Gathering, this features the keynote lecture:

"Confessions: Augustine's and ours" from Gillian Clarke - Professor Emeritus in Ancient History at the University of Bristol, a leading scholar on Augustine.

There will be 11 different workshops to choose from on topics including Social Justice, Mission, Youth, Music, Personal devotion, and Children's ministry.

On the **Sunday morning** there is a refreshing and spirit-filled worship service at St John's, followed by a shared lunch.

This will be a weekend of stimulating conversations, of faith and fellowship and spiritual nourishment. There's even an opportunity for your primary aged children to participate with the inaugural Kidstream, a parallel event offering faith and uplift for the younger generation.

PARLIAMENT STARTS CONSIDERATION OF THE EXPUNGEMENT BILL

Minister of Justice introduced the Criminal Records (Expungement of Convictions for Historical Homosexual Offences) Bill and proposed a Parliamentary apology to men convicted for homosexual acts. This bill had its first reading on 6 July and was referred to the Justice and Electoral Committee. Public submissions have been called for and must be provided to the Committee by **18 August 2017.** The relevant Parliamentary website page is: https://www.parliament.nz/en/get-involved/topics/all-current-topics/historical-homosexual-offences-proposed-to-be-expunged/

The process in a nutshell:

- The deadline is critical: **18 August**
- The submitter can ask to be heard (appear before the committee). It is a good idea you can expand on your written submission and answer questions.

"What do you need to know?

Submissions are publicly released and published to the Parliament website. Only your name or organisation's name is required on a submission. Please keep your contact

details separate, as if they are included on the submission they will become publicly available when the submission is released.

If you wish to include information of a private or personal nature in your submission you should discuss this with the clerk of the committee before submitting.

If you wish to speak to your submission, please state this clearly.

Further guidance on making a submission can be found from the Making a Submission to a Parliamentary Select Committee link in the `Related documents' panel.

If you want to make a submission don't hesitate to ask the Rainbow Wellington Board for assistance if you wish (rainbowwellington@gmail.com). In the event that you appear before the Committee you might want to get a few friends or RW members along to give you "moral support". (Hearings are open to the public and news media.) The RW Board will prepare a submission on behalf of Rainbow Wellington in response to the Bill and the petition, but we also encourage individual submissions as these can express a range of views and reflect your individual experience and knowledge.

Our ask is that the parties who form a Government will adopt the Living Wage for the core public service and extend the Living Wage to their contracted workforce. Let's organise now to show the political parties that we want them to take leadership on the Living Wage.
