

PARLIAMENT STARTS CONSIDERATION OF THE EXPUNGEMENT BILL

On 6 July, the Minister of Justice introduced the Criminal Records (Expungement of Convictions for Historical Homosexual Offences) Bill and proposed a Parliamentary apology to men convicted for homosexual acts The bill's been referred to the Justice and Electoral Committee. The process in a nutshell: The deadline is critical: **18 August.** The submitter can ask to be heard (appear before the committee) - a good idea – you can expand on your written submission and answer questions. "What do you need to know?

Submissions are publicly released and published on Parliament's website. Only your name or organisation's name is required. Keep contact details separate. If included on the submission they will become publicly available when the submission is released.

If you wish to include information of a private or personal nature in your submission you should discuss this with the clerk of the committee before submitting.

If you wish to speak to your submission, please state this clearly. Further guidance on making a submission can be found from the Making a Submission to a Parliamentary Select Committee link in the `Related documents' panel. If making a submission don't hesitate to ask the Rainbow Wellington Board for assistance rainbowwellington@gmail.com). In the event you appear before the Committee, get a few friends or RW members along to give you "moral support". (Hearings are open to the public and news media.) The RW Board will prepare a submission on behalf of Rainbow Wellington, but also encourages individual submissions.
