

ARE WE MIS-READING ISLAM?

Dr. Zainal Abidin Bagir In Conversation with Noel Cheer

The West is not well-served by its news media when it sees Islam only as warmongering, fanatical and dangerous. Certainly there are Muslims as individuals and as groups who fit these categories, but we can also point to Christians, Buddhists, Hindus – and atheists.



In an attempt to offer a balanced view, we have invited Dr. Zainal Abidin Bagir, the director of the Center for Religious and Cross-cultural Studies at Gadjah Mada University in Indonesia to discuss this subject. Dr. Bagir is presently a Visiting Lecturer at Victoria University of Wellington, teaching "Islam in the Contemporary World" in the Religious Studies Department.

The interviewer, Noel Cheer, is a long-term member of the Board of The St Andrew's Trust for the Study of Religion and Society with experience in television interviewing.
