

Speakers: Dr Ben Gray, Newtown Union Health Service and Grant Robertson MP. Topic: Problems with Health – Introduction by Dr Ben Gray: New Zealand has a good health service by international standards. However there are some significant problems. Ben will start his presentation by briefly discussing the impact of income inequality and how New Zealand is not addressing this issue well, and how this is a large contributor to health outcome inequities and conclude by arguing that an important issue is that we are trying to do too much and that it is unlikely that we will make a big difference to health outcome inequities if we don't ration more and stop providing some services.
