Today, think of yourself as surfing on the leading edge of a magnificent creation that has been unfolding for billions of years.

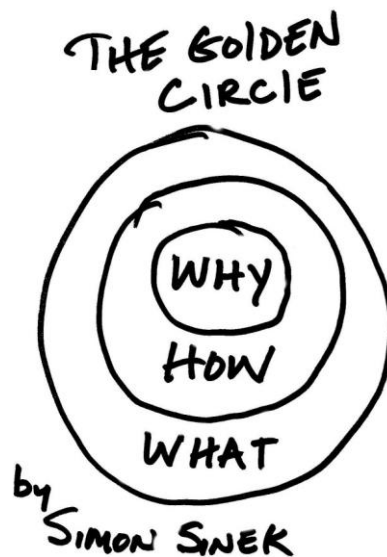

INVITATION TO COMMUNION

St Andrew's is an open community and all are invited to Christ's table.

Wherever you are on your faith's journey, wherever you have come from and wherever you are going to, whatever you believe, whatever you do not believe, you are welcome to participate in the communion, God's meal for all people.

Communion is served by intinction (dipping).

Today we remain in a circle after the communion hymn. Those at the end of the circle near the front of the church will begin communion first.

All are invited to come to the front of the church and receive the bread, or a gluten-free cracker, taking a piece large enough to dip into the wine (silver cup) or grape juice (pottery cup).

Then please eat the bread/cracker which has been dipped in wine or juice.

Or, remain in your seat to be served if mobility is difficult.

If you need an entirely gluten-free communion, please receive from the roaming server.

If you don't wish to receive communion, please be seated – we're glad you are here with us.

KEEPING HOPE ALIVE IN THE HOLY LAND

You are invited to hear New Zealander Brother Peter Bray, Vice Chancellor of Bethlehem University, who will speak at Wellington Cathedral of St Paul on **Thursday February 15th at 6.30pm**. Mint Tea and Arabic Coffee and pastries will be served from 6.15pm.

During his recent sabbatical in Israel-Palestine Peter spent some time meeting people of faith involved in reconciliation and peace building, and visited the Bethlehem University.

Peter is currently visiting New Zealand sharing news from Bethlehem and says: "One of the things I find when I speak to groups is an amazing amount of mis-information or ignorance about this place. My key objective is to share something of the real lives of our students, the context in which we exist and the challenges we face, our response to those challenges and the impact Bethlehem University is having on our students' lives." "In the midst of the unpredictability and uncertainty around them, we want to be an oasis of peace for these young people and provide them with a place where they can be safe, cared for and thrive academically."
