

One of my favourite old Hollywood films .... is a James Stewart black-and-white classic, *Mr Smith goes to Washington*. It is a kind of fairy tale about a decent man in small-town America, who in the pursuit of honesty and public concern is precipitated into politics and ends up in Washington on the threshold of the White House. One memorable line of dialogue has stuck in my mind: *'All good things in the world come from fools with faith.'* The distinguished anthropologist Margaret Mead put the same thought in a slightly different way that challenges us to commitment, and also reassures us in our quest for social and political change: *'Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful citizens can change the world. Indeed it is the only thing that ever has.'*
