Biography:

Robbie Ellis is a composer, music director, comedy songmaker and broadcaster. A graduate of the University of Auckland School of Music, he held the 2012 University of Otago Mozart Fellowship as a composer, and he's had his writing played by the New Zealand Symphony Orchestra, the Auckland Philharmonia Orchestra, Orchestra Wellington, Saxcess, 175 East, the SMP Ensemble, the Jade String Quartet, Choral Chameleon in New York City, Chicago Classical Revolution, the Kaia String Quartet, and more.

In 2015 he moved to Chicago where he works as a music director for improv, sketch comedy and musical theatre. He's part of legendary comedy theatre The Second City, touring on land and sea as a music director and teaching in the Training Center. He also performs at iO Chicago, The Annoyance Theater, ComedySportz Chicago, and many other theatres. He's also done work for the Chicago Symphony Orchestra and Chicago Opera Theater in their education programmes.

Robbie is a classical music broadcaster, formerly working for RNZ Concert as a producer and presenter, and now for Classical WFMT Chicago as a presenter. He performs comedy songs from the piano, and in April 2018 he released his debut album, Pumpkins. He will happily sell you a copy after the show.
