

DON PASQUALE by G. Donizetti (1797-1848) is among the three most performed and best-loved Italian comic operas (alongside Donizetti's *The Elixir of Love* and Rossini's *The Barber of Seville*.)

Donizetti wrote it in two weeks – his 64th opera (or 66th, depending on who you speak to).

Wanderlust Opera toured "Don Pasquale" to 8 locations in North Island, NZ, in January and February 2019, directed by Jacqueline Coats and with musical direction by Bruce Greenfield. The English translation is by Georgia Jamieson Emms.

The performers you are seeing are the original Wanderlust cast, minus Craig Beardsworth who was sadly unable to join us today in his role of Dr. Malatesta.

He has been duly replaced by a foam head on a stick, which we feel is poetic.

The role of Ernesto is not a trouser-role and is always played by a tenor. We wanted to use a tenor but none of them could yo-yo as well as Barbara Paterson.
