Biographies:

Inbal Meggido – cello

Inbal Meggido is Senior Lecturer of cello at the Te Kōkī, the New Zealand School of Music, Victoria University of Wellington, having previously served as teaching assistant to Aldo Parisot at Yale University School of Music for five years. She performs worldwide as a soloist and chamber musician and is well known to Wellington audiences as a member of Te Kōkī Trio, with whom has recorded several CDs for the Atoll label.

Ben Hoadley- bassoon

Ben Hoadley has lectured at the University of Auckland School of Music since 2008, and also teaches historical bassoon at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music. Currently acting principal contrabassoonist with the Auckland Philharmonia, he is a regular guest principal bassoonist with the Sydney Symphony, Opera Australia and Australian Chamber Orchestras. Since 2009 he has presented annual concerts of New Zealand Music for Woodwind at St. Andrews on the Terrace in Wellington.

Paul Altomari – double bass

A graduate of Yale University School of Music, Paul Altomari has led the bass sections of several orchestras in the United States and is now the section principal double bass of Orchestra Wellington. He regularly appears with the New Zealand Symphony Orchestra and Auckland Philharmonia and performs chamber music in North America, Asia and Australasia.
