Biography:

Stringendo was formed in 2015 and consists of string players aged 7 to 16 from the Wellington region, conducted by Donald Maurice. Its primary focus is music from the baroque and classical periods. The children perform four concerts a year usually including one as part of the annual Tumanako commemoration of the bombing of Hiroshima and Nagasaki and one in the St Andrew's on the Terrace lunchtime concert series. Stringendo is financially neutral with no fees paid and no charge to participate. The orchestra's rehearsal venue is provided free by SGI-NZ Wellington. The Soka Gakkai International movement began in New Zealand in the mid 1960s through the efforts of a sole immigrant pioneer from Hiroshima, Japan— Mrs. Yuki Johnston.

Last Sunday Stringendo was delighted to perform in the Cello for Africa concert with Inbal Megiddo and Rolf Gjelsten to support the children at Tamariki School in Kenya
