ZERO CARBON BILL - OUR SAY ON CLIMATE, FAITH AND ACTION

26 June, 5.30pm at Wesley Church Taranaki St. for Soup, Science and Submissions!! We have the opportunity to hear from climate change scientist and communicator Professor James Renwick on the significance of the bill and why your submissions count at this important time.

Rev Motekiai Fakatou will share reflections on climate change and faith.

A bill has been drafted and has passed its first reading in Parliament. As NZer's we have until 16 July to make our voice known via a submission process.

WHY SUBMIT?

NZ is at our most critical point in history in terms of planning for climate change and setting our course for a low carbon economy. Despite the government's clear intentions to reduce overall emissions, NZ's emissions have risen.

We can't afford to let rising emissions continue and need robust legislation. The Zero Carbon Act must provide for limits to emissions, ensure that changes are 'just and inclusive' for more vulnerable sectors of NZ, and that reductions can be enforced. This is our chance to turn the tide. Scientific experts say that we must move to lower emissions in the next 11 years, or we will see irreversible temperature rise and climatic events.

The public meeting will be an opportunity for information sharing with time for questions and discussion. We will have several options to support submissions including key points of the bill, resources for writing submissions and a draft submission for you to use.
