

"After the long voyage, the immigrants looked forward with longing to the sight of their new home."

Alfred Barker wrote: "With very long faces, we saw what a fearfully rough country we had come to, and the gloom was not abated by the sight of three small vessels lying wreaked on the rocks".

And

"To my utter astonishment," William Bannister was to write of his arrival in 1840, "there is not a house or place to receive either cabin or steerage passengers, so that we were obliged to remain on the ship for fourteen days. – I mean women and children. The men and all the boys that were able went on shore for the purpose for making houses for our future abode."

Jane Bannerman wrote, "We had to take up our life and very rough it was at first. Our boxes were piled up on each other and it was six months before we could get them unpacked. There were no rooms in the house and we had a fire outside to cook on...... There was abundant food. How sweet we thought the potatoes; beef and mutton are good, and plenty of fish and pork could be had from the Maori".

MINISTRY SETTLEMENT BOARD

In order to begin the process of finding a new Minister, the congregation is required to elect four people to represent it on the Ministry Settlement Board.

We propose to call a special meeting of the congregation for this purpose on Sunday 16 February following the service. We will use the same system as for electing Parish Councillors.

Each nomination needs to be signed by both nominator and nominee. We will have forms available for this purpose from 2 February. They will need to be handed to one of us by 10 am on Sunday 16 February.

Nominees will be members or associate members of St Andrew's on The Terrace. The Presbytery appoints the Convenor and two other members and Parish Council appoints two of its members to the Board.

PARKING ON SUNDAYS

Hello Folks. The car parks are for the most-part privately rented. During office hours parking must be arranged with the office prior to parking. Outside of office hours (That is after 6pm weekdays, and weekends) single parks No. 1-13 are available. Car parks 14 - 28 are privately rented 24 -7 (that is all day every day). However during the Sunday morning service only it is understood that the parish can use parks 15 – 18 and 21-28.
