# **Biography**

**Emma Sayers** was born in Wellington and after early studies with Judith Utting she went on to study for many years with Judith Clark. After graduating from Victoria University Emma went on to live in Budapest, Hungary, where she studied with Rita Wagner, Ferenc Rados and Péter Solymos at the Ferenc Liszt Academy.

Emma is an active chamber musician, accompanist and ensemble pianist. She has performed and toured many times with new music ensemble Stroma, and regularly collaborates with other local and touring musicians. She is a keen teacher and was on the faculty of Massey University/NZSM for many years.

**Rachel Thomson** was born in Dunedin, New Zealand, and grew up in Wellington where she began her piano studies with her mother. She went on to study with Judith Clark, graduating from Victoria University of Wellington before continuing her studies at the Cleveland Institute of Music in the United States, where she gained a doctorate in piano performance.

Rachel regularly performs with some of the country's leading musicians. She has toured on numerous occasions for Chamber Music New Zealand and is a member of various chamber ensembles including the Koru Trio. She has worked as an orchestral pianist with the NZSO, Orchestra Wellington, and the Christchurch Symphony Orchestra. Rachel is active as a teacher, adjudicator and accompanist.


