VIGIL AND FAST FOR CLIMATE ACTION AT PARLIAMENT

Lockdown has not stopped Climate Change - just pushed it out of the news. But the desire for an urgent, intelligent and equitable response from government has not abated. We need to reduce the risks from ecological disaster, guided not just by good science but also by kindness, justice and respect for all.

Spearheaded by David Goldsmith, a father from Christchurch, who has committed to fast (hunger strike), the vigil outside the Beehive is set to begin again on July 6th. This is a request for support and practical help. Everyone is welcome at the vigil, whether they have chosen to fast or not. The more we are, the stronger our networks and our voice.

Specifically however, we seek a doctor willing to help with the medical aspects of the fast. The other need is accommodation. It would be helpful for David, and his support person, to able to stay somewhere food free within 5 to 10 minutes walk from the Beehive.
