FOR PERSONAL REFLECTION BEFORE THE SERVICE



DONATIONS AND PLANNED GIVING UPDATE

St Andrew's on The Terrace relies on regular donations from planned giving and offerings to support the ministry team for our faith community that includes coordinating and lead the worship, music, children's programme, and pastoral care. At the 2020 AGM we agreed an increased budget for offerings and planned giving of \$101,500 for the year to June 2021. As at 31 December 2020, the halfway point through the year, we were close to meeting this budget with \$49,031 received (Budget \$50,750). Thank you again to the generosity of all who support our work with donations. The end of the tax year is 31 March and we will be preparing donation receipts for the tax year during April. We would like to remind you that the government offers a tax rebate of 33% on all donations to charitable organisations and it is a simple process to claim this rebate that is separate from the rest of the income tax process. Those of you who wish to be able to claim the tax rebate for your donations in the current tax year will need to ensure we have received those payments before 31 March 2021. UPDATE FROM THE MUSIC DIRECTOR

2021 is off to a good start as the St. Andrew's Singers had a workshop for 5 hours at the end of January. We worked on all the music that we will be offering to our worship services this year and it was very successful. Hopefully you will hear and experience an increase in our contribution to the worship experiences of St. Andrew's. We will be singing for worship 5 times this year, with Easter being the first.

We will also have a brass quartet, piano, our newly refurbished organ, and fantastic singing to go along with the Easter celebration!

Here are a few other updates that I would love to let you know about. 1) Hymns

Over the past year, I have noticed that as a congregation we are not sure about when to stand at the start of a hymn. With several different people playing the organ and piano for worship, we all have different styles of introductions, lengths, etc.

I think it would be advantageous if we all would stand as soon as the introduction has begun so that you all can be ready to fully participate in the singing of the hymns. The singing has improved over the past few months, so we all want to continue growing our worship experience as a congregation.

You may have noticed that the Worship Committee has implemented the use of a short verse after the offering has been collected. This will allow each instrumentalist to play as long as they desire. When they finish, they will then play a short intro to the offering verse, we will stand and sing as the offering is brought forth to the front of the sanctuary.

We are looking to start this shortly after Easter.
