"Creativity: Seeing opportunity"

When we have an outlook of gratitude and trust, we assume that we are blessed and live in a world that is, at its core, amazing and lovely. Thus we look for hints of blessing and loveliness in everything we experience. When our experience is harsh, we look for the opportunity to soften it. When it is cruel, we explore means of introducing mercy and kindness.

#### **HUMAN RIGHTS HOUSING GUIDELINES**

Kia Ora, e te Whanau.

Monday 2 August the Human Rights Commissioner issued guidelines - see link below about the need for housing to be recognised by the New Zealand Parliament as a human right. We have many human rights as people. These either are directly legislated for or seen as something natural. Many are in United Nations conventions which New Zealand has ratified in full or in part.

The right to housing is not.

Once housed, laws dictate standards of the housing the landlord must adhere to, what local authorities are responsible for and how we are meant to be neighbourly. But the right to be housed is not enshrined in law. Stephen Turnock, DCM's Director, mentioned this at the end of his wonderful Spirited Conversation presentation on Tuesday. #### **DISCUSSION DOCUMENT - "HATE SPEECH"**

The Government consultation document on proposed changes to "Hate Speech" laws presents the church with an opportunity to speak positively into society.

Dr Stuart Lange, National Director of the New Zealand Christian Network, has written a useful resource/article for church leaders and church members on the proposed "Hate Speech" law change and has also made a submission to the Ministry of Justice consultation document.

Last week, we sent the article, 'A Christian response to suggested "Hate Speech" law changes', and some proposed re-wording, to our database of thousands of Christians who subscribe to our emails. It has also been shared with the denominational heads of the National Church Leaders Aotearoa New Zealand (NCLANZ) and Auckland Church Leaders Meeting.

Why? Because this is an opportunity for us to come together, united by the faith we share in the gospel of our Lord, and to speak both positively and constructively into New Zealand society.

We simply ask that you...

- 1. read the following article download the PDF from our website
- 2. subscribe to NZCN News to keep up to date with this and other key issues facing the church in New Zealand
- 3. forward this email to your Christian contacts and encourage them to do likewise. Additionally, we encourage you to also make a submission to the consultation document if you feel able. You can download a PDF of the NZCN submission to the Ministry of Justice from our website. However, in providing your feedback to the document, we remind you that it is important to use your own words. If you want to quote something from our submission, use exact quotes in quotation marks and say where you got it from.

Above all, your submission must be respectful and accurate, otherwise it seriously undermines and discredits Christian feedback.
