*Wellington City Council has introduced a COVID response package which includes some temporary changes to street parking in the city. The weekend charge had been reduced to \$1/hour. This change is set to run from 21 March to 30 June 2022. 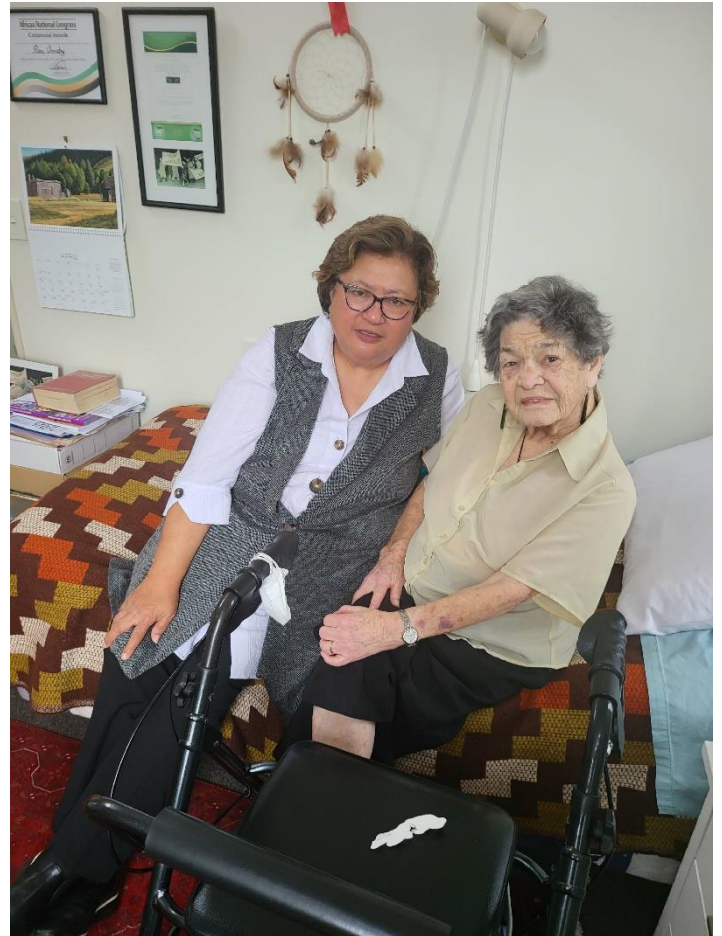
