CHRISTIAN WORLD SERVICE GAZA PALESTINE EMERGENCY APPEAL

"The people of Gaza are living in harrowing conditions with limited resources, and we cannot

stand idly by while they suffer... Our collective efforts can make a significant difference in the lives of those trapped in this nightmarish situation," DSPR. Funds raised will meet some of the urgent needs of people through our long term partner the Department of Service to Palestinian Refugees (DSPR). RELIEFAID APPEAL FOR GAZA




Another option is ReliefAid which is on the ground delivering humanitarian aid in Gaza, where families face unprecedented horror.
