VICTORIA UNIVERSITY LIVING WAGE MEETING OUTCOME

A big step forward in our campaign for a Living Wage at Victoria University! In response to the University not including the Living Wage in its strategic plan, we filled the chamber with over 130 people for the second time this year. After over three hours of discussion on the Living Wage, the University Council passed a resolution requesting the Vice-Chancellor to develop and implement plans to enhance the manaakitanga of all staff, including paying the Living Wage. This applies to contracted workers (like the cleaners who were part of the delegation) and directly employed staff (like tutors). This is the biggest commitment we've received so far from the university, acknowledging and agreeing to pay the Living Wage. It also empowers the University Council to hold the senior leadership team accountable in ensuring these staff are paid a Living Wage.
