## ST ANDREW'S COMMUNITY NOTICES

#### **SUSTAINABILITY UPDATE**

Welcome to this week's Sustainability Update. In our **Good News** spot there's some great progress being made on eco-friendly ways of leaving this Earth. Eco-friendly natural burials have been available in Aotearoa New Zealand for some years, but this month, the first water cremation took place in Christchurch. This piece, by Alex Casey of The Spinoff, (https://tinyurl.com/54462mtk) describes the process, which is fascinating. During a water cremation, the body is wrapped in a shroud and dissolved in a 95 percent water and 5 percent alkaline solution. The process takes four hours and is 90 percent less harmful to the environment than flame cremation. There was also an interesting piece on Country Life on Radio New Zealand (https://tinyurl.com/knr7vpu8) about a couple who are providing funeral homes with biodegradable caskets and ash urns made from New Zealand wool. Finally, in a thought-provoking article entitled, 'The Reductionist Delusion', (https://tinyurl.com/mr34hjub) energy consultant Art Berman, sets out to prove that we've got it all wrong about the solutions to climate change. In a way that you don't see coming, he concludes: "We don't need new energy sources. We need a new relationship with energy that includes respect for Nature and our place in it, humility and restraint. One that recognizes that some thresholds, once crossed, don't rewind. And some systems, once overbuilt, don't transition—they unravel." Well worth a read. - Sustainability Group

#### **DANCES OF UNIVERSAL PEACE OFFER**

Parish Council has happily accepted Heather-Rose's offer to present this session of song/movement/meditation practice after service on 29<sup>th</sup> Sunday, to gauge if there is any interest in "tasting" this Sufi-inspired form. Sayings, phrases, teachings from many traditions, in a variety of languages, set to simple melodies are taught, simple steps are added, and song and dance (usually in a circle) are then woven together and repeated as a moving mantra. #### **RECYCLING OF HOUSEHOLD BATTERIES**

Household batteries can be dropped off for FREE at Karori Library, Kilbirnie Library, Te Awe Library (Brandon St), Island Bay Community Centre, Newlands Community Centre, Tawa Community Centre, and the Southern Landfill Tip Shop. For Hutt Valley and other members, Bunnings' stores have recycling bins where used batteries can be left. Happy recycling.

#### **RECYCLING AT ST ANDREW'S**

During May we saved **5.8kg** of waste from landfill, slightly up on the previous month. This month metal lids were the hero knocking Tetra Pak beverage cartons off their perch. As a reminder, we collect all types of plastic lids, metal lids, Tetra Pak beverage cartons and used pens for recycling. There are containers for each sort of material in the North Vestry and a take-home information sheet about what we do and don't collect. Please make sure everything you drop off is clean and dry and follow the instructions for preparing Tetra Paks, in particular. (They need to be opened out flat and kept as one piece, i.e. not cut up.) Thanks for all your recycling efforts. It's really making a difference to what goes into landfill. - Anna Smith, Sustainability Group
