hosting a screening of a powerful, short film called *Think Like a Forest* (https://tinyurl.com/fbu2uafv). To celebrate the Season of Creation, we are inviting members of other eco churches in Wellington to join us. *Think Like a Forest* brings the vision of Recloaking Papatūānuku (https://tinyurl.com/kae2k54r) to life. Recloaking is a bold, science-led initiative to restore, regenerate, enhance and manage over two million hectares of native forests and wetlands across Aotearoa in the next 30 years. The protagonist in the film, hunter, fisher and conservationist Sam the Trap Man, speaks to kaitiaki already doing this work on the ground, and presents a vision for a regenerative future in which we take action to create resilience for our land and communities. The session will run from 12.00 – 1.30pm to allow for discussion.

SUSTAINABILITY UPDATE

An electronic waste drop-off day was held yesterday, 13 September in the Zealandia overflow carpark. **On going** with our e-group: Think Like a Forest - We discussed the film and agreed that it was a great fit for St Andrew's. Eco Action Plan 2025 update: Very much a work in progress. We've all been busy! Season of Creation - Sonia has confirmed with Fei that she will coordinate a service for Sun 28 Sep, led by the Sustainability Group **Good news:** One candidate for mayor is campaigning on Rewilding Wellington. SeeWilliam Pennywise, the Rewilding Clown (James Barber) for an actually forward-looking vision.

RECYCLING AT ST ANDREW'S

Congratulations! During August we saved **9.5kg** of waste from landfill. This is up on previous months, partly because we are now collecting heavier household metal items. In the six months since we have been measuring our impact, we have saved **38.5kg**. This is in addition to the milk bottle tops that Brian Burrell adds to his sack for the Sustainability Trust. As a reminder, we have added two new categories to our collection hub - household metal items and hair care and hair colour containers and aerosols. They join all types of plastic lids, metal lids, Tetra Pak beverage cartons and used pens. There are containers for each sort of material in the North Vestry and a take-home information sheet about what we do and don't collect. Make sure you have one at home for easy reference. Thanks for all your recycling efforts. It's really making a difference to what goes into landfill. - Anna Smith, Sustainability Group

RECYCLING OF HOUSEHOLD BATTERIES

Household batteries can be dropped off for FREE at Karori Library, Kilbirnie Library, Te Awe Library (Brandon St), Island Bay Community Centre, Newlands Community Centre, Tawa Community Centre, and the Southern Landfill Tip Shop. For Hutt Valley and other members, Bunnings' stores have recycling bins where used batteries can be left. Happy recycling.
