

EXPLORING FAITH - AWAKENED - 12 OCTOBER AFTER CHURCH

Dear Congregation. Our next exploring faith session using the progressive Christianity book Awakened, will be on Sunday October 12th. It will start at 12 noon and finish by 1 pm. Conference room 3. This next chapter is titled "Biblical Women: Teaching Jesus a lesson." You are very welcome in the session whether you have been before or not. Each session is stand alone. The focus Bible quote for the session is as follows: Now the woman was a gentile of Syrophoenician origin. She begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter. He said to her, "Let the children be fed first, for it is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs". But she answered him, "Sir, even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs." Then he said to her, "For saying that, you may go - the demon has left your daughter." And when she went home, she found the child lying on the bed and the demon gone. (Mark 7:26-30) The session will include reading of the progressive reflection on this topic, discussing some focus questions together and watching a brief video from Caleb Lines expanding on the topic. SUSTAINABILITY UPDATE

I was heartened to read in the latest Climate Club e-newsletter that Conservation Minister Tama Potaka has announced a \$6m investment into Raukūmara Pae Maunga project. This is an iwi-led biodiversity protection and restoration project that not only delivers their ecological goals, but also generates jobs, supports iwi aspirations while continuously nurturing new generations of indigenous conservation leaders. Within the A Rocha and Eco Church network in Aotearoa there are many restoration and biodiversity projects also underway. In Te Whanganui-a-Tara/Wellington this includes St Michael's in Kelburn, supporting the Pukehinau Reserve biodiversity restoration project, and A Rocha Wellington groups restoring the Waiu Wetland in Wainuiomata and Owhiro Stream in south Wellington. RECYCLING AT ST ANDREW'S

I don't have a full September update on the amount of material recycled through our centre but I know from the weeks I collected there was at least 2.3kg. As a reminder, we have added two new categories to our collection hub - household metal items and hair care and hair colour containers and aerosols. They join all types of plastic lids, metal lids, Tetra Pak beverage cartons and used pens. There are containers for each sort of material in the North Vestry and a take-home information sheet about what we do and don't collect. Make sure you have one at home for easy reference.
