The Braided River – We Believe by Rev Dr Fei Taule'ale'ausumai

In Christchurch we gathered, under banners of We Believe, voices like tributaries converging—some smooth, some swollen, some carrying silt and memory from far-off valleys of faith.

They spoke of a braided river, a weaving of waters and witness, the many streams of Aotearoa's church—Pacific drums, rainbow banners, Pākehā prayers and Māori waiata—each strand shining in the sunlight of our shared belonging.

But then, a shadow, a murmur of "false teaching," dark currents unnamed yet known, and I wondered— can the river judge its own waters when all flow from the same rain?

Still, we sang.
We danced our island dances,
we broke bread rich with laughter,
and the Spirit moved between us
in the warmth of open palms
and the rhythm of our drums.

Sir Lloyd's tribute never reached the floor—perhaps carried instead by wind and memory, to where prophets wait in quiet grace.

And when the skies closed above the airport, flights grounded and hearts restless, we found communion in conversation—Wellington souls debriefing the tide.

It was not an easy week, but faith seldom is. Among my people I found solace, hospitality as theology, love as liturgy, generosity as Gospel.

And in that braided river of hope and contradiction, I saw again what I believe—that God still flows through all our tangled waters, finding the way to the sea.

SUSTAINABILITY UPDATE

A climate action storytellers' night is being held in Wellington on Thursday 6 November, 5.30 - 7.30pm. Climate Kōrero Pōneke (https://tinyurl.com/2pdxvrur) is the third kōrero in a series dedicated to celebrating the inspiring mahi of individuals and organisations driving climate action in our communities. Four passionate speakers will share their journeys, insights, and practical ways you can get involved in local climate action. The event follows the Pecha Kucha format - each speaker presents 20 slides, with each slide shown for 20 seconds. This fast-paced visual format is a great way to share stories and keeps everyone on their toes! After each presentation, you'll have the chance to kōrero directly with the speakers, so bring your questions and curiosity. The four speakers are: Gareth Hughes, Wellbeing Economy Alliance, Ellie Clayton, Kaicycle, Emma Osborne and Gareth Jardine, EkaRua Rebicycle and Orini Rokx-Taratu and Santino Morehu, Future Unity. - Anna Smith, Sustainability Group.

RECYCLING AT ST ANDREW'S

I don't have a full September update on the amount of material recycled through our centre but I know from the weeks I collected there was at least 2.3kg. As a reminder, we have added two new categories to our collection hub - household metal items and hair care and hair colour containers and aerosols. They join all types of plastic lids, metal lids, Tetra Pak beverage cartons and used pens. There are containers for each sort of material in the North Vestry and a take-home information sheet about what we do and don't collect. Make sure you have one at home for easy reference. RECYCLING OF HOUSEHOLD BATTERIES

Household batteries can be dropped off for FREE in Wellington at Karori Library, Kilbirnie Library, Te Awe Library (Brandon St), Island Bay Community Centre, Newlands Community Centre, Tawa Community Centre, and the Southern Landfill Tip Shop. There are also now three battery recycling points in Hutt City: War Memorial Library, Eastbourne Neighbourhood Hub and Naenae Neighbourhood Hub.
